A translation volunteer opportunity is often remote (coming into the office is not required) and is based on documents needed for translation from both English to Spanish and Spanish to English. We accept interns who are strong in both or one of the two.

- Strong Spanish writing skills
- Strong attention to detail
- Ability to meet deadlines
- Knowledge of issues in international development preferred, but not required

Translations:

An effective translation is not a literal translation. Translation is an art that requires changing not only the words themselves, but also the syntax and sometimes even the way the phrase is expressed to make the meaning clear. When translating documents from Spanish to English, the final document should read as if it was originally written in English (or vice versa from English to Spanish). This can require splitting up long sentences, changing passive voice verbs to active voice, and even rewriting phrases completely so that the same concept is expressed more directly or specifically. We request that you edit the translations you submit to make them as clear as possible.

TO TRANSLATE TO ENGLISH
